- Fiscally constrained
- Regional TIPs combine to form State TIP (STIP)
- Updated every two years at conclusion of Ten Year Plan process

10 Year Statewide Queue of Projects

- State Commitment to build listed projects
- Fiscally constrained
- Regions provided funding targets
- New projects added to outer years & move to TIP when they reach year 4
- Updated every two years
- Federal and State funded projects

TIP Amendment Process

- Amendments occur quarterly
- Address "substantial" changes to project scope, schedule, and cost
- 1. NHDOT provides draft Amendment that is reviewed and endorsed through the Interagency Consultation Process
- 2. Proposed Amendment is processed by staff into the MPO TIP Revision Database
- 3. Required 10-30 day public comment period is started and timed to end the day prior to the MPO Policy Committee meeting
- 4. Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) reviews changes and makes a recommendation to the MPO Policy Committee
- 5. MPO Policy Committee approves the Amendment after the end of comment period, a public hearing, and discussion.

- A Public Comment Period began May 24, 2022 and concludes on June 7, 2022.

- Net funding change in TIP: +\$61,808,094
- Net funding change in LRTP: +\$112,720,765
