James Hayden Award

The James Hayden Award recognizes those in the region who have made significant contributions to their communities and/or the greater region in natural resource conservation and planning. The award was established in remembrance of Jim Hayden, RPC Commissioner from Newfields and District Conservationist for the Soil Conservation Service (now Natural Resources Conservation Service) for Rockingham County for many years. Jim retired from the SCS in the mid 1980s and became RPC Commissioner in 1988. He was instrumental in the development of the County Soil Survey and in efforts to protect the natural resource base of the County and region in the face of rapid growth and development. He contributed to the creation of many of the essential tools that most towns still use today in planning, including wetlands, shoreline and aquifer protection overlay zoning districts and also promoted the use of soil and resource mapping in community and site planning. Previous recipients of the Hayden award include: Forest Griffin of North Hampton & Exeter (2003), Larry Smith of East Kingston (2007), Alice Tonry of Hampton Falls (2008), Mary Currier of RCCD (2009); The Tucker and French Families of Kingston (2010), Sue Foote, Seabrook Conservation Commission and Planning Board (2011), Chris Ganotis on behalf of *North Hampton Forever* Land Conservation Initiative (2012); Phil Auger, Rockingham County Forester and Land Conservationist (2013), and Jill Senter, Plaistow Conservation Commission (2014) and Bob Goodrich, Stratham Conservaton Commission, RCCD Board of Supervisors, State Conservation Committee (2015) and The Walker Family of Monahan Farm (2016).

Daniel Quinlan Award

The Daniel Quinlan Award recognizes those in the region who have made significant contributions to sound community and regional planning and who have fostered intermunicipal cooperation and collaboration in the region. The Daniel Quinlan Award was established in memory of Dan Quinlan, a long serving RPC Commissioner, Executive Board member and RPC Chairman from Windham. Dan was exemplary over many years in service both to his Town (as library Trustee, Planning Board member and in other roles) and to the regional community as RPC Commissioner and member, at various times . He worked to ensure the best for the Commission, but also to ensure that the Commission achieved a high standard of service for his community and the region. His skill was to bring people together to solve problems.
